Today's Text: Matthew 11:1-6,16-24

"When Jesus had finished instructing his twelve disciples, he went on from there to teach and preach in their cities. Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?' And Jesus answered them, 'Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. And blessed is the one who is not offended by me." Matthew 11:1-6

"But to what shall I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling to their playmates, 'We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not mourn.' For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon.' The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' Yet wisdom is justified by her deeds." Matthew 11:16-24

1. John the Baptist: Honest Doubt Because of Misplaced Expectations (vv.1-6)

"Jesus answered, 'My kingdom is not of this world. If my kingdom were of this world, my servants would have been fighting, that I might not be delivered over to the Jews. But my kingdom is not from the world.' Then Pilate said to him, 'So you are a king?' Jesus answered, You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice." John 18:36-37

The kingdom of God is the present-day REIGN of the living Christ in our heart, in our lives and in our relationships in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Heidelberg Catechism, Question 123 Q. What is the second petition? A. Your kingdom come.

That is: So rule us by your Word and Spirit that more and more we submit to you. 1 Preserve and increase your church.² Destroy the works of the devil, every power that raises itself against you, and every conspiracy against your holy Word.³ Do all this until the fullness of your kingdom comes, wherein you shall be all in all.4

If I am to continuously receive Christ with confidence and grace (live in the wonder of His Kingly rule), I must:

- Understand His kingdom and adjust my expectations. In a less than perfect world (living in the "Already, but not yet.") I should understand the REALIZE>>REPAIR>>REFILL cycle.
- 2. Humility replaces criticism as I rejoice in His goodness, mercy and authority.
- 3. Fight against apathy and embrace nobility of
