Message: Christ-honoring Living and the Blessing of God

**Text:** 1 Peter 3:8-12

"Finally, all of you, have unity of mind, sympathy, brotherly love, a tender heart, and a humble mind. Do not repay evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary, bless, for to this you were called, that you may obtain a blessing. For 'Whoever desires to love life and see good days, let him keep his tongue from evil and his lips from speaking deceit; let him turn away from evil and do good; let him seek peace and pursue it. For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil."" 1 Peter 3:8-12


"We may therefore represent the overall argument of verses 8 to 12 as follows: 'Finally, all of you, be like-minded, loving toward one another, compassionate, and humble (v.8), not returning evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary blessing, for you have been called to such a righteous life, in order that by this righteous living you may obtain God's blessing on your life' (v.9). 'For in the Psalms, God promises blessings to those who live righteously' (vv.10-12)."

"Verses 8 to 12 as a whole should not be taken as evidence for final salvation by good works, for they are addressed to those who are already Christians and already have an imperishable 'inheritance' kept for them in heaven (1:4). Yet this passage does present a bold affirmation of the relation between righteous living and God's present blessing in this life. As such it provides a needed corrective to careless, half-hearted Christians living in any age, and a powerful motivation to the kind of holy living to which Peter says 'all Christians have been called' (v. 9)." Wayne Grudem, I Peter, p. 150
